









Key insight



August is the peak month for tourism, with 709,000 visitors and 1.7M overnight stays.

More tourists are staying in 4-star hotels (58-61%), suggesting a preference for mid-tier accommodations.

UK, Italy, and Spain are the most frequent travelers to Budapest.

Revenue growth in 2024 is noticeable, with a higher percentage of foreign visitors compared to 2023.

VII. kerület (District 7) remains the most visited district, likely due to its nightlife, ruin bars, and cultural attractions.
